

## **NCV Meeting Minutes**

November 6, 2025

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER:

President Carm Finocchiaro called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm at El Camino Country Club. The meeting opened with Dan Omniewski leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

### 3. INTRODUCTION OF VISITORS:

Scott McClellan welcomed 37 members to the meeting; currently the roster is 71 members as the club added four new members last month. The good news: dues will remain the same next year, payable in January at \$72 per couple. Make checks payable to North Coast Vettes and mail to Scott McClellan.

#### 4. TREASURER'S REPORT:

Submitted by Dave Tracy also known as the "Digger of Decayed Stumps (DDS): as of November 6, deposits were made from the following revenue: club meeting raffle and dues. There were no expenses. The treasury balance remains positive.

#### 5. NEW BUSINESS:

- c. Yvonne Finocchiaro rose to ask the membership if the Carlsbad Hi-Noon Rotary Club could use the military flags of the club at the CHNR meeting of November 10, 2025 in honor of Veteran's Day and the USMC 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday. Carm Finocchiaro reviewed how the flags were purchased by club members in honor of their loved ones. The records reflect:
- Army flag was purchased by Lisa Lerandeau and her brother in honor of their father.
- The Marine Corps flag was purchased by Nancy and Cary Thomas in honor of his father.
- The Navy flag was purchased by Yvonne and Carm Finocchiaro in honor of her father.
- The Air Force flag was purchased by Larry Harker.
- The Space Force flag was purchased by an anonymous donor.
- The Coast Guard flag was purchased by Royann and Scott McClellan.
- The club purchased the American flag.

Each flag has a stand. The flags and stands are currently stored at the Finocchiaro home.

The membership agreed by acclamation to the use of the flags for the November 10 Rotary event.

d. Bob Ekstrom revisited the Board terms proposal he discussed at the October 2 meeting, and the description he distributed to the membership via email prior to the meeting. (The written description is attached here by way of reference.) Discussion ensued. Bob Ekstrom made a motion to advance the proposal to the Board of Directors for final determination. Carm Finocchiaro, Dan Omniewski and John Trzcinka thanked Bob Ekstrom for his efforts.

6. 50/50 DRAWING: Dan Omniewski described the club's holiday party last year which cost \$50 per person. Knowing all costs have gone UP this year he remarked that donations to the holiday party have changed the cost this year: cost per person this year is \$32, reduced from last year. As he was readying the drawing tickets, Dan reminded everyone that these are individual drawing winners and each person may do what he/she wants with the winning proceeds. Donations will be put toward the holiday party next year. Patty Eddy won the \$40 drawing.

#### 7. CLUB ACTIVITIES:

President Carm reported that last Thursday's *Breakfast in Vista* had 13 members attend. He also invited all to submit ideas for activities to Royann and Dianne as the new Activities team. Carm put forth a couple of ideas to kick-start the creative thinking:

- b. Route 66 will celebrate its Centennial year in 2026, what might that look like?

Scott White asked for additional volunteers for Royann McClellan and Dianne Grosenbach as they put together the 2026 activities roster.
