2025 Chevrolet Corvette ZR1

10/10 C/D RATING



Each year, Car and Driver tests hundreds of vehicles using rigorous instrumented evaluations and real-world driving ipressions from its epert editors. Rankings are based on more than 200 data points, including acceleration, handling, comfort, cargo capacity,fuelefficienacy, value, and, of course, how enjoyable each car is to drive. Their goalis simple: to give readers a complete, trustworthy picture of the cars that matter most at any price. At the top of the 2026 list is the jaw-dropping Ferrari F80, which earned a perfect 10 out of 10 score and starts at a staggering \$3,735,000. YES, IT IS OVER three million dollars.

Right behind it, and turning just as many heads, is the 2025 Chevrolet Corvette ZR1. Also earning a perfect 10 out of 10, the ZR1 starts at just \$178,195, making it an extraordinary value in the exotic sports car world.

Car and Driver sumed it up perfectly: "If the Z06 is a naturally aspirated scalpel, the twin-turbo Corvette ZR1 is a 1064-hp meat cleaver with laser-

guided handling." And in their overview: "Times have changed since Car and Driver dubbed the first ZR1 'the Corvette from hell back in 1990,but those three characters will carry a heavy burden. The 2025 Corvette C8 ZR1 shoulders that load proficiently with 1064 horsepower emanating from its mid-mounted twin-turbo V-8 and a finely honed chassis." (Mike Smith, PSCC)

CORVETTE RACING

Corvette Racing closed out the 2025 IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship- in dominating fashion at Petit Le Mans, sweeping all three GTD PRO titles!

At Michelin Raceway Road Atlanta, the No. 3 Corvette Z06 GT3.R, driven by Antonio Garcia and Alexander Sims, clinched the Drivers, Teams and Manufacturers Championships for Chevrolet and Corvette Racing by Pratt Miller Motorsports.

A strong runner-up finish from the Nol. 4 Corvette Z06 GTE.R of Tommy Milner, Nicky Catsburg and Nico Varrone helped seal Chevrolet's 15th GT class title, and its first in GTD PRO legacy.

This marks the 13th time Corvette Racing has swept all three GT championships, Manufacturers, Drivers and Teams in a single season.

The story begins with a man named Harley Earl who was the head of design at General Motors. He set out in the early 1950s to make America's first sports car. It debuted at the Waldorf Astoria hotel in New York.

The first 300 were all polo white, with red interior, and an in-line six-cylinder engine called the Blue Flame. See? Red, white and blue.
